1. DRAMATIC READING (10:00 AM-11:30 AM)

- One participant per team and one team per college.
- Duration: 3 minutes
- Read the given literary text aloud with emotion, expression and pause.

2. RHYME FEST (10:30 AM-12:00 PM)

- One participant per team and one team per college.
- Duration: 5 minutes
- Write and sing your own poem, to your own tune.
- Karaoke and instrumental music are permitted.

3. MODERN ART (1:00 PM-2:30 PM)

- Only one participant per college.
- Theme Reimagining mythical characters in Greek Literature
- Duration: 1 hour 30 minutes
- Students must create their art on the spot.
- Art must be done on chart.
- Participants must bring their own stationeries.

4. LITERARY MIX & MATCH (10:30 AM-12:30 PM)

- Maximum of 8 participants per team and one team per college.
- Duration: 10 minutes maximum for each team.
- Select various characters from multiple literary works and create a plot for the chosen characters together.
- Enact the plot as a skit on the stage.
- No recorded voices or dialogues are allowed.

5. ALTERNATE END WRITING (1:00 PM-2:30 PM)

- One participant per college.
- Duration: 1 hour
- Read the short story provided on the spot and create an alternate ending for the same.
- Length: Maximum 200 words (approximately 1 page)

6. LIT. TRIALS (1:30 PM-3:00 PM)

- 2 participants in a team; one team per college.
- Duration: 3 minutes for each team
- One speaks for and another speaks against the character.
- Any famous literary character will be given on the spot.

7. MEME MASTERS (2:00 PM-3:00 PM)

- 2 participants per college and one team per college.
- Duration: 30 minutes for each team.
- Topic will be given on the spot.
- AI generated images are strictly prohibited.

8. ALL THE WORLD'S A STAGE (1:30 PM-3:30 PM) (TALENT SHOW)

- Maximum of 10 participants per team; one team per college.
- Duration: 8 minutes for each team.
- Participants can showcase their individual talents on stage like singing, dancing, mime, etc.,
- Creative combinations of talents are encouraged.

9. QUIZ BATTLE (10:00 AM-11:30 AM)

- 2 participants per team and one team per college.
- 3 rounds will be conducted (MCQs)
- Area: Booker Prize winning works and authors

10. ORAL OLYMPICS (1:30 PM-3:00 PM)

- 2 participants per team and one team per college
- Three Rounds:
 - a) Tongue-Twisters
 - b) Pronunciation
 - c) News Reading
- Tongue twisters and words for pronunciation will be displayed on the screen to be read out by participants.
- A clipping will be screened for which the teams have to read a news report.

11. DESIGN A COVER (11:30 AM-12:30 PM)

- Only one participant per college.
- Create a cover page for any one of the given literary works.
- The cover page design must align with the theme of literature, creativity and artistic expression (AI generated images are strictly prohibited).
- Submission Format: Designs must be submitted in JPEG/PNG or PDF format.
- The design must include the event title, 'JOSLIT' and space for additional text (e.g., author name, event details).
- Choose any one from the given literary works: Gulliver's Travels/Around the World in Eighty Days/The Alchemist (Paulo Coelho)/Life of Pi

12. TRAILER CREATION (9:30 AM-11:30 AM)

- Maximum 4 members in a team; one team per college.
- Choose any one of the given literary works and create a trailer in animation.
- The work must be acknowledged in the trailer (e.g., through credits or title).
- Duration: Minimum of 1 minute to Maximum of 2 minutes for each team.
- Submit in MP4 format with a resolution of atleast 720p
- Choose any one from the given literary works: Doctor Faustus/She Stoops to Conquer/The Importance of Being Earnest/Death of a Salesman

RULES

- Each participant is allowed to participate only in 2 events (maximum).
- Bring your own properties and costumes for all events.
- Bring background music in pendrive if needed.
- Be modest in your appearance.
- Vulgarity in any form will lead to disqualification.

Note: Judges' decision will be final.

Additional round will be conducted in event of tie.
